

TROOP ONE PERMISSION SLIP
New Scout Induction at Camp Manatoc on February 22 - 24, 2013

Permission slips and money are due no later than Tuesday, February 12

EVENT: Join us at Camp Manatoc to welcome our newest Scouts to Troop One. On Friday, the "old" Scouts will go out to Forester Cabin at Camp Manatoc. We will spend Saturday morning conducting a search and rescue event, in conjunction with the Ohio Search Dog Association (this is really a "don't miss" activity). Then we will spend the afternoon preparing for the new Scouts arrival and the Induction Ceremony.

New Scouts and their families should plan to arrive at Forester Cabin at 5 P.M. on Saturday. Please dress warmly and prepared for the weather. An excellent dinner and conversation will be provided by the Troop. After dinner, your Webelos will go on a short hike and they will join us at the Council Fire Ring for Troop One's fabulous Induction Ceremony. New Scouts will spend the night with the Troop in Forester Cabin. Parents should pick up their new Troop One Scouts at Forester Cabin at 9 A.M. sharp.

GEAR: Each Scout must be in full Class A uniform and *wearing his boots* for the car trip to and from the campout. Cold weather clothing and gear are required for this campout. The weather could be wet and rainy, or snowy and very cold, so be prepared. Layers are important. Bring extra clothes and socks. **Cotton is bad**; synthetics and wool are preferred. Waterproof boots or snow boots are recommended. We are sleeping in tents, so your sleeping bag should be rated at 20° Fahrenheit (preferably lower). Adding a fleece blanket inside your sleeping bag is a good idea. If you do not have a cold weather sleeping bag, ask about using a spare one at a Troop meeting.

Boots are a requirement for all Troop One campouts. Come prepared for all types of weather.
