

TROOP ONE PERMISSION SLIP
“Show and Do” at Camp Stigwandish, March 15 - 17, 2013

Permission slips and money are due no later than Tuesday, March 5

EVENT: Our March campout will be at Camp Stigwandish in Madison, OH. This is our annual “Show and Do” campout. It is an opportunity for the new Scouts to learn the ropes (and the knots) from the older Scouts. New Scouts will learn the basic skills they need for future campouts with the Troop. And experienced Scouts will have the opportunity to pay it forward -- by helping the next generation of Troop One Scouts.

New Scouts will be in the cabin, and older Scouts may be outside in tents. New Scouts are reminded to bring their Scout Handbook with them on all campouts (and to all meetings). You never know when an opportunity to complete a required skill will present itself.

Older /Venture Scouts will also have a special meeting on Saturday evening.

COST: \$17.00 per person (make checks payable to Boy Scout Troop ONE)

LEAVING: **Friday, March 15, 2013** (plan to arrive at First Baptist Church **by 6:15 pm**)

RETURNING: **Sunday, March 17, 2013** (estimated return time: **11:00 am**)

GEAR: Each scout must be in full Class A uniform and *wearing his boots* for the car trip to and from the campout. Cold weather clothing and gear are required for this campout. The weather could be wet and rainy, or snowy and very cold, so be prepared. Layers are important. Bring extra clothes and socks. **Cotton is bad;** synthetics and wool are preferred. Waterproof and insulated boots or snow boots are recommended. Older Scouts may be sleeping in tents, so your sleeping bag should be rated at 20° Fahrenheit or lower. Adding a fleece blanket inside your sleeping bag is a good idea. If you do not have a cold weather sleeping bag, ask about using a spare one at a Troop meeting.

Boots are a requirement for all Troop One campouts. Come prepared for all types of weather.
