EVENT: Join us for an exciting weekend away from home (... and Akron ... and Ohio, for that matter). In April, we will go to the Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn, Michigan; we will camp at the Lower Huron Metro Park in Belleville, MI.

Wikipedia says this of the Henry Ford Museum..... "[the] Henry Ford Museum began as Henry Ford's personal collection of historic objects, which he began collecting as far back as 1906. Today, the 12 acre site is primarily a collection of antique machinery, pop culture items, automobiles, locomotives, aircraft, and other items: an IMAX theater, [...] The 1961 Lincoln Continental, SS-100-X, that President John F. Kennedy was riding in when he was assassinated, [...] The bus on which Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat, [...] Bill Elliott's record-breaking race car clocking in at over 212 MPH at Talledega in 1987," and much more.

Greenfield Village is not open at this time of year. Instead, Scouts will be able to attend an IMAX film.
