***We need your commitment by returning this form by Tuesday, August 20, 2013***

**WHO:** Scouts and their families who want to enjoy the beauty and fun of Presque Isle State Park! Families are invited to join in the adventure, and see the number one troop at its best. This is the only family campout of the year. Scouts will live and eat in their own patrol campsite and save family time for later during “free” time. Families, not including their scouts, will camp and eat with the Java Patrol, the adult patrol.

**WHAT:** Come out for a fun weekend. We will be at the park during the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Battle of Lake Erie and the Tall Ships will be in port (touring them will require an extra fee). You can bring a bicycle to ride more than 13 miles of multi-purpose trails inside the park. Helmets and locks required. We encourage you to transport your own bicycle(s) yourself, or you can indicate on the form below if you need to have your bike transported in the troop’s rental trailer (space available). There is also canoeing and kayaking available at the park (cost details on website above). Bring some extra cash for snacks.

**COST:** Just \$22.00 per person, which covers food and camping fees. It does not cover rental of bike or kayak or tour of the tall ships. Details on <http://trooponeakron.org/whats happening.html>

**LEAVING WHEN:** Friday, September 6, 2013 all drivers and scouts must arrive at First Baptist Church *by 6:15 pm!* We plan to leave no later than 7:00 pm.

**RETURNING WHEN:** We will return to First Baptist Church during the late morning on Sunday, September 8, 2013. Scouts will call you upon returning to the church. Estimated time of return is 1:30 pm. If your Scout has another commitment within 2 hours of our return time, please indicate it on the face of the permission slip and discuss with Scoutmaster Myers.

**WHERE CAMPING:** Sparrow Pond Family Campground, 11103 Route 19 North, Waterford, PA 16441, 814-796-6777. Day trip to Presque Isle, 301 Peninsula Dr #1, Erie PA 16505.

**GEAR:** Each scout must be in full Class A uniform & *wearing his boots* for the car trip to and from the campout. Scouts and adults must bring a go bag that they have with them at all times (see <http://trooponeakron.org/gobag.html> for details).

***Boots are a requirement for all Troop One campouts.***  
**Come prepared for all types of weather. BRING RAIN GEAR! Pack a Go Bag.**  
**Remember – COTTON IS BAD, especially in cold or wet weather!**
