Forms:

- Complete all of these as soon as possible or by Tuesday June 16.
- BSA Annual Health History and Medical form** filled out and turned in to Michele Gunther. Please remember to copy your insurance card and attach.
- Parts A and C** are to be filled out by the parent. Check signature, date must be current Medicines listed on the back of the Class I form **must** match what is sent to camp. Medicines must be in the original bottle whether prescription or over the counter.
- Part B Medical Evaluation** by a doctor filled out on the same form with parts A and C and turned in to Michele Gunther.
- Release of camper form** filled out and turned in. This lists only those allowed to pick up your scout. Make sure the Scoutmaster knows your parental rights status, return to Teresa Michaels
- Scout Merit Badge programming schedule** filled out and turned in to Mr. Kostura.
- Adult participation at Summer Camp form** if not already turned in. Please talk to Mr. Myers.

Uniforms:

- Every evening all scouts and scouters must wear full Class A summer uniform. (Scout Socks, Scout Shorts, Scout belt, neckerchief slide, and Scout uniform shirt from the Scout Shop with correct insignia. For 2010 the PLC has voted to have the green shoulder loops with the green troop numeral on all uniforms including the new centennial uniform. Change to green!
- Every day scouts and scouters will wear the Class B uniform during the day everyday. Class B is scout shorts, scout socks, scout belt and Green Troop One scouting T-shirt. Scout needs 2-3 forest green Troop One Shirts. Shorts may be the scouting shorts or the switchbacks or the new centennial pants that zip off.
- Scout must have a Troop One neckerchief - We can sell you a replacement for \$7.00 (I think).
- Consider buying additional Troop One T-shirts if available. You receive one if you paid for camp.
- Handbook! Scout must bring his scout handbook or buy a new one if he is not yet First Class!
- All clothing and all belongings are marked with Scout's name with permanent marking pen. Uniform parts must be marked well since all uniforms will be laundered on Tuesday night.

Other check-offs

- I have read through the summer camp book given out in May. I got a "What To Bring List" at Scout meeting or in the summer camp book and have everything I need.
- My scout sons have their tent partners and this has been communicated to and agreed by the SPL.
- Troop Leaders are going to set-up camp on Saturday July 17. This is expected of all troop leaders. All second year and up scouts are welcome if they intend to work (this is not a play time). We meet at the Church, load the troop gear and go to Manatoc to set up. Troop and any personal gear is left there overnight at your risk (in a locked trunk). Scouts should return by 5:00 p.m. Do not presume we have enough drivers - please come and help. We can use mowers and trimmers, trash bags, and cold water.
- You must arrange transportation for all your gear and your scout for Sunday. We will check in at the Church Parking lot near the garage at 9:00 am. Don't be late.
- When arriving at the church lot on Sunday, be in full uniform, with boots on, health form, handbook, a water bottle and your medicines in the original containers (see the summer camp book for details).
- Come to Wednesday Night Parents' night and Court of Honor (July 21). See who is Scout of the Year. Retreat is at 5:45 at the parade field. Dinner is in our campsite followed by a brief Court of Honor.
- I know that no Scout will be allowed to call home without permission of the Scoutmaster. No scout may use a cell phone during the week with the permission of the Scoutmaster. Also, no scout may leave the Camp -- even with you -- unless you talk personally with the Scoutmaster. These are strict safety rules.
- If I am a new parent, I have read and understand the section of the summer camp book on the homesick scout.

Policy Statement RELEASE OF CAMPERS

- Section A** It shall be the policy of Camp Manatoc to release a camper only to an authorized person as listed on the Camper Release Form as approved by the camper's parent or legal guardian.
- Section B** Each camper leaving camp shall notify his Unit Leader and the Camp Office as to the estimated time of departure. The camper shall wait at the camp office for the appropriate adult providing transportation.
- Section C** When the adult arrives, the camp administration will verify the name on the Camper Release Form and ask to see a photo identification card (Driver's License, State Identification Card, Military Identification Card, etc.). After the verification of the name on the form to the picture ID, the adult shall sign out the camper. The sign-out form shall include the camper's name, time leaving, time returning and the name and signature of the person the camper is being released to.
- Section D** NO CAMPER SHALL BE RELEASED TO ANYONE NOT LISTED ON THE CAMPER RELEASE FORM. HOWEVER, THE UNIT'S SCOUTMASTER MAY RELEASE THE CAMPER TO THE ADULT BY SIGNING THE WAIVER BELOW. The Scoutmaster then assumes full responsibility for the safety of the camper.

WHAT TO BRING TO SUMMER CAMP

This is not meant to be a complete list, just help for getting ready.
Each scout must pack his own belongings.

Bring (1) a trunk or duffle bag or a backpack to pack in and (2) a sleeping bag, a sheet and pad or cot.
The sheet is for the nights that are too hot to get in the sleeping bag.

All clothing and possessions must be marked with the scout's NAME and "Troop One" or "T 1" using a laundry or permanent marker. Mark small and in a place on the clothing not easily seen when wearing. Try to pack in a zippered bag such as a larger sports bag or duffle bag. Some scouts have discovered the luxury of using a trunk or lock box. You should choose the bag or whatever that is the most waterproof. Always put smaller items in separate "zip lock" bags or other "stuff sacks" and then put these smaller bags in your pack or duffle bag. This aids the scout in keeping his stuff neat and dry! You should include a dirty clothes bag.

- All payments and extra fees to scoutmaster. (for example motorboating MB fees)
- Spending money for fees and souvenirs. The trading post is open daily. The scout will want or need MB books, t-shirt, candy, slushies, pop, patches, ...
- Completed medical form (BSA Annual Health History and Medical form, signed by parent and doctor).
- Combination lock for trunk (keep combination so they can call you and get it. Don't use a key lock.)
- Trunk or duffle bag. Lots of scouts find the large plastic Foot Lockers perfect.
- 2 Clothes hangers (We hang up and wear the uniform every evening)
- a clothes line for inside the tent (about 12' of rope).
- Lawn chair

- Scout Outdoor Essentials (firestarters and knives require Fireman Chit and Totin Chit)
 - Scout Pocketknife on scout string (those who ignore scout string lose knives)
 - Personal First Aid Kit
 - Rain Gear - poncho, jacket with hood, hat, ...
 - Unbreakable, leak proof water bottle and a way to carry it.
 - flashlight with fresh batteries
 - spare bulb & batteries or a backup flashlight (essential on a long camp & batteries go fast at summer camp)
 - Matches in a waterproof container
 - Firestarters (less imp. In summer camp, but someone may need them)
 - Sun protection!!!
 - Insect Repellent (must work on ticks) in an unscented non-aerosol spray or cream.
 - Boots (don't forget to waterproof them). These are to be worn to Church Sunday Morning.
 - Shoes (tennis shoes, one old pair to get wet and yucky, no open toed sandals)
 - watch (strongly recommended, also strongly recommended this is a cheap watch)
 - sunglasses (optional)
 - Notebook and pen(s) or pencil(s) (absolutely essential)
 - Boy Scout Handbook (absolutely essential, buy a new one if you lost the old)
 - Merit Badge books if taking merit badges at camp
 - one-fourth roll toilet paper in a zip lock bag. (probably unnecessary, but who knows)

- Sleeping stuff
 - sleeping bag with top sheet
 - closed-cell foam pad for under sleeping bag or a cot
 - Plastic ground cloth for under foam pad (approx. 3'x6') if on ground
 - pillow

What to bring to Summer Camp - continued

- ___ Cleanup kit - it should contain
 - ___ 2 towels, wash cloth (dark in color doesn't show dirt as fast)
 - ___ nearly used-up bar of non-perfumed bio-degradable soap in a soap container or plastic bag.
 - ___ toothbrush in a tooth brush holder,
 - ___ toothpaste (sample size)
 - ___ floss (makes a good emergency repair string too).
 - ___ Comb
 - ___ Something to carry all this in to the shower (optional)

- ___ First Aid kit (packed in its own bag and ready for inspection) this is a second class requirement and a scout essential.
 - ___ Moleskin for blisters
 - ___ a few adhesive bandages (band aids)
 - ___ very small roll of adhesive tape
 - ___ several gauze pads (2-1/2 or 3 inches)
 - ___ couple quarters for emergency phone calls
 - ___ Prescription medicines in original containers in a zip lock bag at check in.

- ___ Eating kit or mess kit (everything must be boilable)
Only essential if taking cooking Merit Badge.
 - ___ spoon, fork, knife
 - ___ plate
 - ___ bowl
 - ___ mug (a second cup is handy too, remember to put your name on it)

- ___ Scout uniform(s) [come to church Sunday morning in Full Class A with neckerchief]
 - ___ Scout hat with brim for shade
 - ___ scout belt
 - ___ 1-2 uniform shirts, with correct patch placement
 - ___ 1 pair scout long pants (optional in summer of course)
 - ___ 1-2 pair scout shorts
 - ___ 1-2 pair scout socks
 - ___ 3 Green Troop One T-shirts (bring gray ones too if you have them)
 - ___ Troop One sweatshirt or hoodie (if owned)

- ___ Other clothing (adjust list for warm or cold) See page 52 Scout Handbook.
 - ___ Enough other T-shirts for the week. Buy extra Troop One scout T-shirts. (none advertising non-scout like things, e.g., no "beer/tobacco" companies shirts.)
 - ___ Short sleeved shirt if desired
 - ___ 6 changes of underwear
 - ___ extra Shorts (must be solid and as similar to scout shorts as possible.)
 - ___ 2 long pants (counting uniform) (some activities require long pants, e.g. swimming MB)
 - ___ warm jacket (summer weight for cool evenings if we have any)
 - ___ work gloves for working around fire or doing a service project
 - ___ 6 pair socks (including uniform)
 - ___ Swimming trunks
 - ___ boat shoes (optional, not great for walking on the rocky roads and trails)

ABSOLUTELY -

NO radios, walkie talkies, game boys, other electronic gadgets. NO CELL PHONES and NO valuables
