Forms:

Complete all of these as soon as possible.

Tell Mr. Slazinski and Mr. Judge you are going to summer camp NOW.

- BSA Annual Health and Medical Record form.** Downloaded from the Troop One Summer Camp Website filled out and turned in. Please remember to copy both sides of your insurance card and attach.
 - Parts A and B** are to be filled out by the parent. Check signature, date must be current Medicines listed on the back of the Class I form **must** match what is sent to camp. Medicines must be in the original bottle whether prescription or over the counter. Tetanus shot must be received within the last 10 years.
 - Part C Medical Evaluation** by a doctor filled out on the same form with parts A and B and turned in. You should show **Part D** to the doctor when you go if you expect to attend a high adventure base this year.
- Release of camper form** filled out and turned in to Mr. Judge. This lists only those allowed to pick up your scout. Make sure the Scoutmaster knows your parental rights status!
- Scout Merit Badge and Program Worksheet** filled out and turned in to Mr. Kostura – this will be done in troop meetings. Just make sure it is done.
- Adult participation at Summer Camp form** if not already done. Please talk to Mr. Slazinski.

Uniforms:

- Every evening all scouts and scouters must wear full Class A summer uniform. Worn Sunday at check-in at Church as well. (**Official** Scout Socks, **Official** Scout Shorts, Scout belt, neckerchief and slide, and Scout uniform shirt from the Scout Shop with correct insignia and green shoulder loops.)
- Every day, scouts and scouters will wear the Class B uniform during the day, every day. Class B is scout shorts, scout socks, scout belt and Green Troop One scouting T-shirt. Scout needs 2-3 forest green Troop One Shirts. Shorts may be the scouting shorts or the switchbacks or the new centennial pants that zip off.
- Scout must have a Troop One neckerchief – Cathy Sullivan can sell you a replacement.
- Buy additional Troop One T-shirts if available. You receive one if you paid for camp.
- Handbook! Scout must bring his scout handbook or buy a new one if he is not yet First Class or is teaching!
- All clothing and all belongings are marked with Scout's name with permanent marking pen. Uniform parts must be marked well since all uniforms may be laundered on Tuesday night. Watch bleeding through.

Other check-offs

- I have read through the summer camp guidebook online at the summer camp webpage (listed above). I got a "What To Pack" List at Scout meeting or on the summer camp webpage and have everything I need.
- My scout has their tent partners and this has been communicated to and agreed by the SPL.
- Youth Troop Leaders are going to set-up camp on Saturday before we move into camp. This is expected of all troop leaders. All **second year and up** scouts are welcome if they intend to work (this is not a play time). We meet at the Church, load the troop gear and go to Manatoc to set up. Troop and any personal gear is left there overnight at your risk (in a locked trunk). Scouts should return by 5:00 p.m. Do not presume we have enough drivers - please come and help. We can use mowers and trimmers, trash bags, and cold water. Wear work clothes and bring water bottle.
- You must arrange transportation for all your gear and your scout for Sunday. We will check in at the Church Parking lot near the garage at 9:00 am. Don't be late.
- When arriving at the church lot on Sunday, be in full uniform, with boots on, your health form, handbook, a water bottle that attaches to you and your medicines in the original containers and in a named Ziploc bag.
- I know that no Scout will be allowed to call home without permission of the Scoutmaster. No scout may use a cell phone during the week without the permission of the Scoutmaster. Also, no scout may leave the Camp -- even with you -- unless you talk personally with the Scoutmaster. These are strict safety rules.
- If I am a parent of a first-year camper, we work really hard to avoid the homesick scout, please help us.
